# Title II Deadline Brief

A non-legal planning brief for digital accessibility deadlines under the Department of Justice Title II web and mobile rule.

County and city leadership, ADA coordinators, IT, communications, and counsel.	Public download	Operational planning material. Not legal advice or a certification of compliance.

## Planning dates

Entity size	DOJ compliance date	Operating implication
50,000 or more people	April 26, 2027	Use the added year to move from isolated scans to inventory, owners, remediation cadence, vendor dependencies, exceptions, and evidence.
Fewer than 50,000 people and special district governments	April 26, 2028	Begin scope and ownership mapping early so vendor, document, and mobile app work does not compress into the deadline year.

## What to prove before the deadline

- The entity knows which digital services, documents, vendors, and mobile apps are in scope.
- Findings have assigned owners, severity, due dates, remediation status, and evidence references.
- Exceptions and alternative access paths are documented, reviewed, and time-bound.
- Procurement and vendor reviews are connected to the same operating record as internal remediation work.
- Leadership can see progress, open risk, and stale evidence without relying on ad hoc spreadsheets.

## Boundary

PublicProof record principle
Keep decisions, owners, evidence, exceptions, vendor dependencies, and remediation status in one dated operating record that can be reviewed by staff, counsel, and leadership.
